The mission of the Springfield Area Parent Child Center (SAPCC) is to foster a caring community of healthy families by offering services to support and nurture children and adults. The SAPCC is a not-forprofit organization governed by a voluntary board of directors. We believe that healthy families are the cornerstone of our community.



OUR CHALLENGE TO MEET COMMUNITY NEEDS

The Springfield Area Parent Child Center began providing services in 1992 with 3 parttime employees. Today we have 35 full and part-time employees serving over 1500 families a year.

The Springfield Area Parent Child Center works closely with agencies and schools to develop services and expand its programs to meet community needs. However, every week 9 to 15 young children, youth and their families are turned away because of lack of space. We have waiting lists for many of our important services including infant/toddler care and intensive parenting programs. Enrollment is limited for on-site training, play groups, childcare provider training and educational classes due to our current space constraints.

More space is essential to increase our services to meet the needs of the communities we serve and improve the quality of our work. In 2004, we purchased land and have since begun the planning process to build a new building.

EXPANDING SERVICES WITH A NEW BUILDING

A new building will allow the SAPCC to expand its services, bringing to the community:

- More infant/toddler childcare available for working parents and teen parents
- More education and job training for young parents
- More support for "at-home" parents
- · More educational opportunities for early care and education providers
- More opportunities for parents and children to socialize in their community
- More employment opportunities with competitive wages and benefits for the community.

We purchased land adjacent to our existing building, hired an architect and engineer to do a feasibility study. We are now in the process of seeking funding for the next steps, which include building a new facility. We welcome any contributions - money, time, and/ or expertise - to help make this dream become a reality!

The SAPCC services include:

- parenting classes
- referrals and funding for childcare
- infant and toddler child care
- preschool opportunities
- job training and educational services for teen parents
- professional development for early education providers
- home visits to families with young children
