SAPCC Program Outcomes and Performance Measures ~ 2015-16

PlayWorks Child Care

Average Enrollment:

56 children year round

Using the Teaching Strategies Gold assessment system 80% of the children enrolled met their learning goals. 95% showed progress in their final checkpoints.



Parenting Classes

8 Different parenting classes were offered

77 Adults/47 Children for Total participation of 54 Families

Pre/Post surveys indicate that the majority of attendees felt more capable of handling their child's behavior and felt less parenting stress. Post attendance showed a gain of parenting knowledge/insight.

Child Care Subsidy and Referral

Child Care Subsidy applications received and processed within 30 days of application: 714

Resource and Referral requests: 117 with 80% of clients indicating the service to be helpful

Learning Together Program

Average Enrollment:

5-8 mothers and 6-7 children also enrolled in PlayWorks child care.

5 Students graduated and obtained their diplomas in June of this year.

100% of students enrolled have improved parenting skills, knowledge of child development and community resources
